Ong KEN SEN (1963) is the artistic director of TheatreWorks, where he created the renowned Flying Circus Project, which brings together international artists traveling through Asia, sharing their contexts amongst themselves and young people in the local sites. He founded the Arts Network Asia, a micro-grant peer organization and the international Curators Academy focused on the synergy between contexts and curation in Asia. He is also the founder of the Singapore International Festival of Arts (SIFA) in 2013 and was the Festival Director for four editions from 2014 to 2017. He is the first Singaporean artist to have received both the Young Artist Award (1992) and the Cultural Medallion Award (2003). He was awarded the prestigious Fukuoka Asian Arts and Culture Prize in 2010.
