# **Festival Readings Sochi**

24 - 26 February 2017

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## What are the Festival Readings?

The Festival Readings are an intense three-day introduction to artistic festival management. The Festival Readings aim to illustrate festivals as platforms with strong meanings for art, the artist and their place in society, paying close attention to context. Certain instruments such as communication, production and budget are discussed during the Festival Readings. For the Festival Readings three internationally renowned and experienced festival leaders are asked to illustrate their work in detail. They stay the entire three days. The lectures are followed by a discussion with the participants.

During the Festival Readings participants will attend performances programmed by the Winter International Arts Festival. The performances will allow encounters with artists – an opportunity to discuss the influence festivals have on their work and the consequences for their artistic path. The Festival Readings are targeted at students of art and cultural management, dramaturgy and production; staff members in governmental cultural departments; and young people with specific motivation to attend. The first edition of the Festival Readings took place in 2013 in Romania during the Sibiu Performing Arts Open Market.

### Who organises the Festival Readings Sochi 2017?

The Festival Readings Sochi 2017 are jointly organised by The Festival Academy (an initiative of the European Festivals Association) and the Winter Arts International Festival (WIAFS).

The Winter Arts International Festival was founded in 2007 in the capital of XXII Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games by the Russian Concert Agency. Yuri Bashmet, Sochi 2014 Ambassador, is Artistic Director of the Festival. Growing in size every year and developing the programmes, the festival offers local and regional audiences an outstanding selection of events and unique opportunities to meet a wide range of arts. Since 2007 the festival has presented different programmes of classical music, jazz, opera, classical ballet, drama theatre, popular music, cinema as well as the exhibitions of audio-visual arts, and jewellery. Many Russian and international artists have joined the celebration of the arts on the Black Sea coast. With a long list of globally renowned performers, the 2008 Grammy Award-winning Moscow Soloists Chamber Ensemble and the state symphony Orchestra Novaya Rossiya (New Russia) are the resident orchestras of the festival. The festival is organised with the financial support from the government of the Russian Federation, the Ministry of Culture of Russian Federation, the Organising Committee of Sochi 2014, and the administration of the city of Sochi.

The Festival Academy, an initiative of the European Festivals Association (EFA), offers various training formats on festival management to young, dynamic and passionate festival makers worldwide. Its motto is: "The true role of a festival is to help artists to dare, to engage in new projects," a statement coined by Bernard Faivre d'Arcier, former Director of the Avignon Festival.

### When and where?

The next edition of the Festival Reading will be held in Sochi, Russia, 24 - 26 February 2017. The date of arrival is 23 February and the date of departure is 27 February.

The Festival Readings will be held in the conference hall of the Hotel Zhemchuzhina.

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### **Speakers**

Kristine De Mulder (Belgium) was Director-General of Europalia International until the end of 2016. In this role, she was responsible for the business and artistic leadership of a series of major arts festivals dedicated to Italy, Russia, Europe, China, Brazil, India, Turkey and Indonesia. Being an art historian, archaeologist and interior designer, De Mulder has built a career which is rich in cultural and communications experience, in the academic field, but as well in the media and the financial world. Kristine De Mulder is member of the Boards of Directors of some of the major cultural events in Belgium, such as the Festival van Vlaanderen, the Queen Elisabeth International Music Competition... In 2012, she was made baroness by King Albert II for her cultural engagement.

**Grzegorz Reske** (Poland) is a performing arts curator and producer. Reske works as curator for Konfrontacje Teatralne (2013-2017), and since 2015 he has been appointed as main selector for Kalisz Theatre Meetings, where he assist as well in reconstruction of festival structure. Most recent professional activities include collaboration with TR Warszawa, which he supports in development of international relations and collaboration. Since 2013, Reske is associate curator at the East European Performing Arts Platform. He currently works on a book: "I will kill you, darling; or: how to stop a successful art project".

**Erik Söderblom** (Finland) Opera, theatre, festival director and pedagogue Erik Söderblom is one of the most powerful forces in the Finnish performing arts' scene. From 1988 to 1990 Söderblom worked as Director at the Turku City Theatre, afterwards he co-founded the Q-teatteri, now one of the leading theatre companies in Finland. In 2009 Söderblom was appointed Artistic Director and Chief Executive of the Helsinki Festival, concluded in October 2015. In 2016 Söderblom was invited to become a member of the Artistic Committee at Tampere Theatre Festival, the most prominent performing arts festival in Finland. Söderblom has, in addition to his artistic achievements, contributed to Finnish theatre as an important pedagogue.

**Hugo De Greef** (Belgium) is a co-founder, board member, and the General Coordinator of The Festival Academy. He will act as moderator throughout the readings.

Each reading starts with a presentation by a speaker, however short but with a maximum length of 20 minutes. The aim will be to create a dialogue with the other speakers and the participants, who will have the opportunity to ask questions and make comments. The focus is on the speaker's experience of festivals, making the programme, and collaboration with artists. This can draw in the specific context of the festival in terms of locale, budget, and audience.




